Off the side of your desk


No support network

Super steep learning curve


Some people will be angry that you're doing this work

### What we've done so far:

- Initial survey in late 2022
  - To gauge the interest of the participants
  - To find possible presenters and facilitators
  - Was quite successful
- Creation of the official steering committee
- List-serv
  - Set up with the support of CARL
- Second survey in late 2023
  - We received less answers
- Monthly book club

### What we've done so far:

- Multiple CoP Sessions, including:
  - Introductory meeting
  - Indexing Tools and Journal Level Indicators
  - The state of persistent identifiers for research in Canada
  - Research ID and Impact: An Introduction
  - Who is Responsible for Responsible Use of Metrics?
  - VOSviewer (bibliometric social network tool)
  - Social network analysis in knowledge mobilization work
  - SCOPE Framework for Research Evaluation
  - Session on knowledge mobilization
- Currently working on:
  - Lighting talk session: to involve the members more
